

### MISSION

*To maximize academic achievement for every student in a high school and college environment.*

All LMCHS courses are Honors or Advanced Placement level courses. Students enrolled at LMCHS will take courses required for high school graduation while taking college courses towards a post-secondary certificate, college diploma, associate degree, and/or industry certification. LMCHS students are required to enroll in a minimum of four courses per semester including high school and college courses.

### ELGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Must be a rising 11th or 12th grade student and a resident of Mecklenburg County.
- Incoming 11th grade students must have completed the following courses: NC Math I (Algebra I), NC Math II (Geometry), English I, English II, Biology, World History, Civics and Economics, and Health/PE by the end of 10th grade year.
- Incoming 12th grade students must have completed the following: 10th grade requirements listed above and English III by the end of 11th grade.
- Student must have (1) a current unweighted GPA of 2.8 or higher or (2) an unweighted GPA of 2.5 with qualifying test score(s).

### TRANSFER CREDITS

- Most courses will transfer to all 4-year NC Public Universities.
- Private colleges and out-of-state colleges often have their own policies regarding transfer credits.
- Parents and students are encouraged to contact private schools and out-of-state institutions for course credit information.

Levine Middle College High School (LMCHS) is an honors magnet program offered by Charlotte-Mecklenburg Schools that consists of grades 11-13. Students have the opportunity to earn college credit during their junior and senior years as well as an optional 13th year. Students can earn an associate degree or two years of transfer college credits.

Levine Middle College High School is a Comprehensive Innovative High School located on the Levine campus of Central Piedmont Community College. Students participate in the Charlotte-Mecklenburg School Choice Lottery for admission and must meet academic entrance requirements.

Students at Levine will complete their high school graduation requirements while taking CPCC courses towards an associate degree or career/industry certification.

All CPCC courses, books, and fees are free for our students.



*Levine Middle College High School students consistently exceed local, state, and national average scores on the ACT, Advanced Placement exams, and SAT.*

*An average of 50 students per year earn an associate degree through Central Piedmont Community College.*

## A DAY AT LMCHS

- Students will take CPCC courses that follow their associate degree or Career/Industry Certification pathways. CPCC tuition and fees are free to MCHS students.
- Scheduling and course selection tend to be more flexible than most high schools.
- Students may take CPCC courses on ANY CPCC campus.
- Students are free to come and go during the day as long as they attend all scheduled classes.
- While high school classes are offered from 11:20-4:20, college classes may be offered in the morning, afternoon, evenings, or on weekends depending on student needs and course offerings.

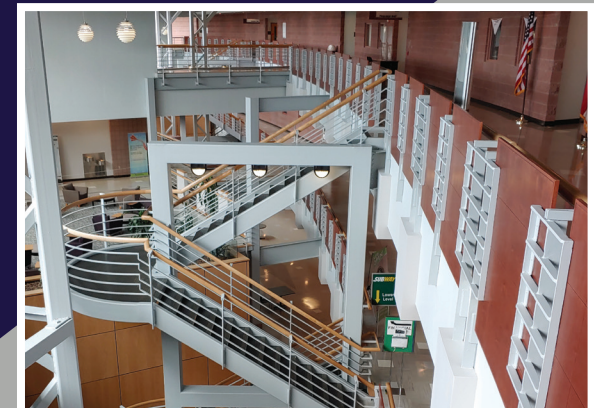

## PROGRAM GOALS

- For students to complete High School Diploma requirements.
- For students to earn transferable college credit, an associate degree, or Career/Industry certification at no cost.
- To focus on academics while in high school and college classes.
- To experience college in a supportive environment.

## THE GRADE 13 OPTION

- Students may stay a third year in Middle College High School and take additional college classes with the opportunity to complete an associate degree and/or Career/Industry Certification.
- This is an optional program that is open to students who are in good academic standing with CMS and CPCC and have met all graduation requirements.
- Students enroll in only CPCC classes and a CMS Middle College High School Seminar course during grade 13.

## ADDITIONAL FACTS

- The Middle College HS becomes each student's CMS school of record.
- All Middle College High Schools are located on CPCC campuses.
- Transportation is provided by CATS at no cost to students.
- The Middle College HS calendar is consistent with CPCC's calendar and will differ from the CMS traditional school calendar.
- Students have access to all CPCC student amenities such as labs, libraries, and student activities.
- 11th grade students must earn a cumulative CPCC GPA of 2.0 or higher for the 11th grade school year or they will be reassigned to their CMS home school for the 12th grade.
