- Discuss the behavior expectations and rules and ensure that each parent has received the Rules for the Nest information online or as a hard copy.
- Reinforce that Selwyn is a "bully-free" school and bullying behavior is not acceptable.
- Present and review the CMS Student Code of Conduct.

BUS RULES

- Safely enter and exit the bus
- Remain seated on the bus at all times. Heads, hands, and feet do not touch others and remain inside the bus
- Obey directions given by the bus driver
- There is no eating or drinking on the bus
- There is no hitting, fighting, touching others
- Do not throw objects out of the bus windows/doors

Today we focused on appropriate behavior in the cafeteria and cafeteria rules. With approximately 870 students at Selwyn, it is very important that each child cooperate and follow the expectations and procedures for appropriate behavior in the cafeteria and during lunch. CAFETERIA RULES

Students walk quietly in a line when entering the cafeteria.
Students wait their turn quietly in the serving line, and speak respectfully to the servers using appropriate language when requesting items.
Students wait their turn quietly in the cashier line.
Students take all utensils, napkins and snacks before they sit down at a table and do not return to the serving line. If additional items are needed, a student may raise his/her hand to request them from an adult monitor.
Students may engage in quiet conversation with other students sitting near them. Noncompliant students will be reminded of the expectations and moved to a different location, if the behavior does not improve, at the discretion of the cafeteria monitor .
Students clean up their area and wait quietly in line for the teacher to pick them up.
If the class is on restricted lunch, a red cup will be placed on the tables.

Today's focus addressed character traits, manners, and anti-bullying. We understand that other cultures and families have their own rules and expectations for behavior and manners. Our ultimate goal is to help children become responsible, respectful citizens who get along with others. We will continue to encourage positive interactions among the students and the development of appropriate social skills. We expect positive behavior at school and enlist your help to support our efforts.
