-Student survey will be shared in the SEL lesson on Friday **October 2<sup>nd</sup>**

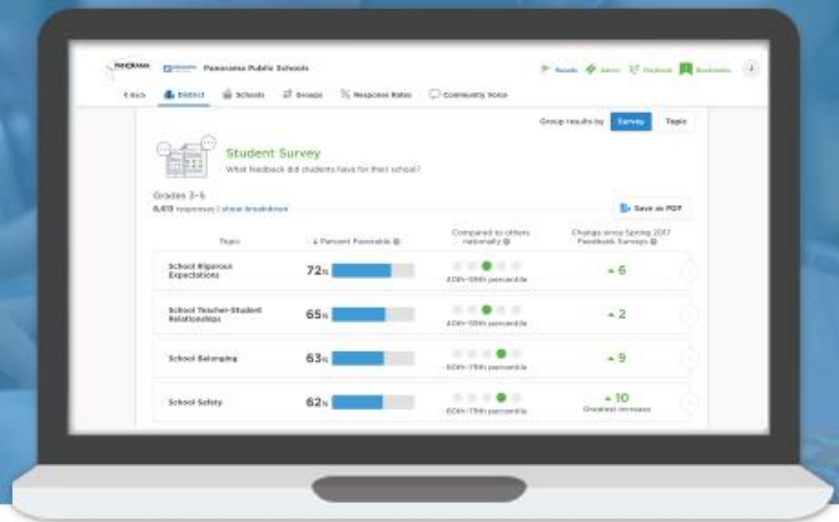
-Students in grades 3-12 complete the survey **independently**

-Typical time frame: **35-40 minutes**

-Content includes: **Growth Mindset, Positive Feelings, Challenging Feelings, Social Awareness, Self-Efficacy, and Emotion Regulation**

## Measure and understand social-emotional learning to support the whole student.

CMS is partnering with Panorama Education to measure and improve social-emotional learning (SEL). Panorama's comprehensive survey tools will allow CMS to identify where students need support with their SEL skills and competencies, develop plans based on individual, school, and district-level SEL results, and monitor progress over time.



### Who will participate in this initiative?

Students in grades 3-12 and teachers of K-2 students will participate in the SEL survey. Once results are available, school leaders will take part in a professional development workshop to make sense of and act on the data in their schools.

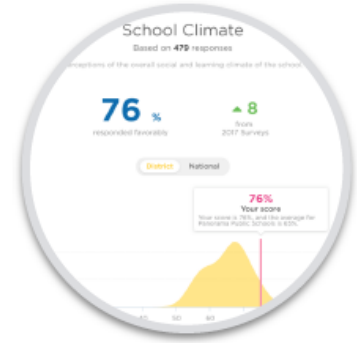
- ✓ **Obtain ongoing, diagnostic data**

### What will the surveys measure?

Panorama's surveys gather student self-perception data about SEL skills and competencies, well-being, and support systems. CMS can use this data to understand progress toward the goal of access to social and emotional supports for all students.

Panorama's SEL surveys were developed by researchers at Harvard's Graduate School of Education. The survey content follows design best practices, is continually tested for validity and reliability, and will be appropriate for in-person or remote learning.
