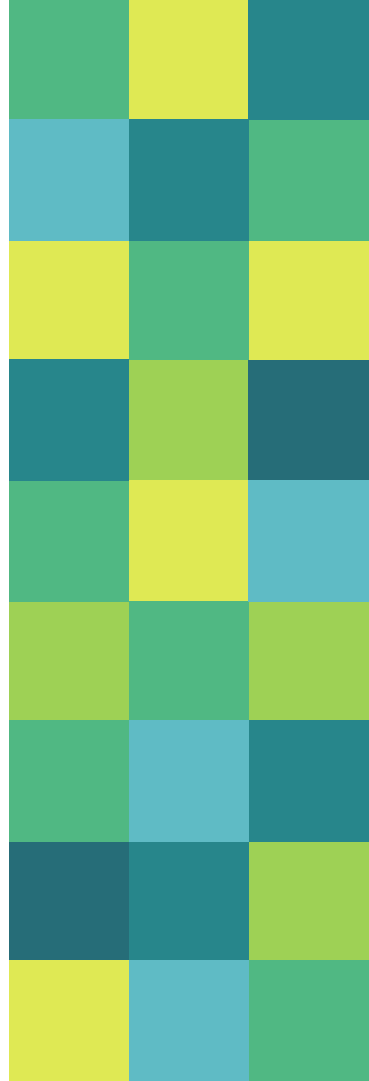

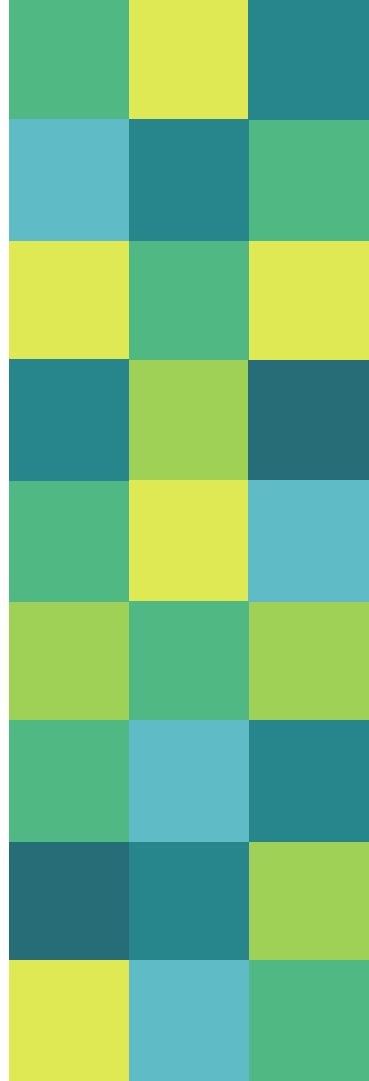


What does it mean to be a Title I School?

Being a Title I school means receiving federal funding (Title I dollars) to supplement the school's existing programs.

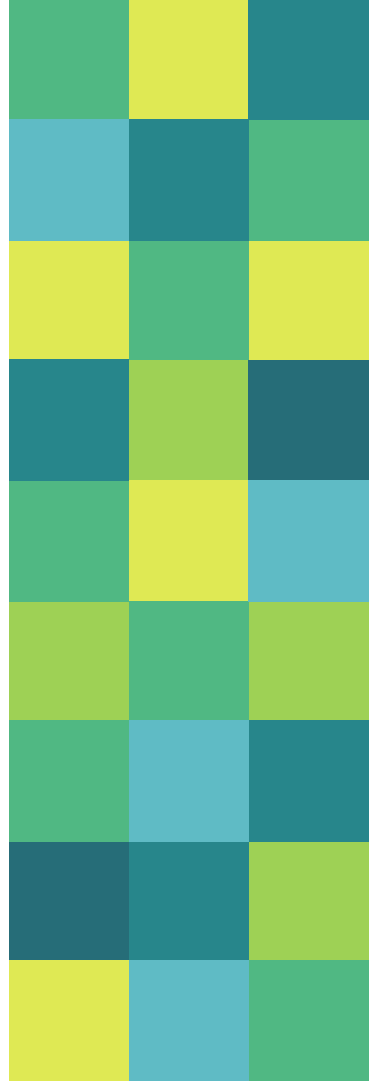
These dollars can be used for...

- Purchasing supplemental staff, programs, materials, and supplies to ensure students have access to high quality instruction
- Conducting parental Involvement meetings, trainings, and activities
- Recruiting/Hiring/Retaining Highly Qualified Teachers
- Professional development opportunities for staff

A school receiving Title I funding is required to set aside 1% of its Title I allocation for parental involvement.

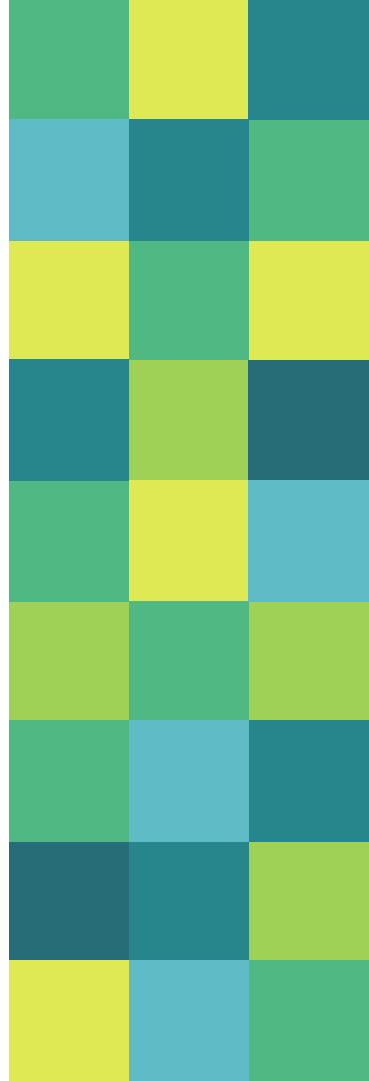
This plan addresses how the District will implement the parental involvement requirements of the *Elementary and Secondary Education Act*.

- How schools will work to build the schools' and parents' capacity for strong parental involvement to improve student academic achievement

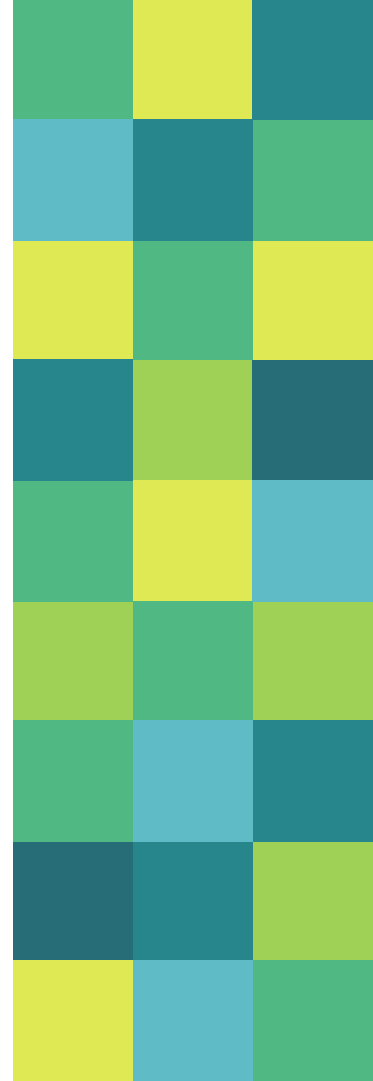

Goal 2:

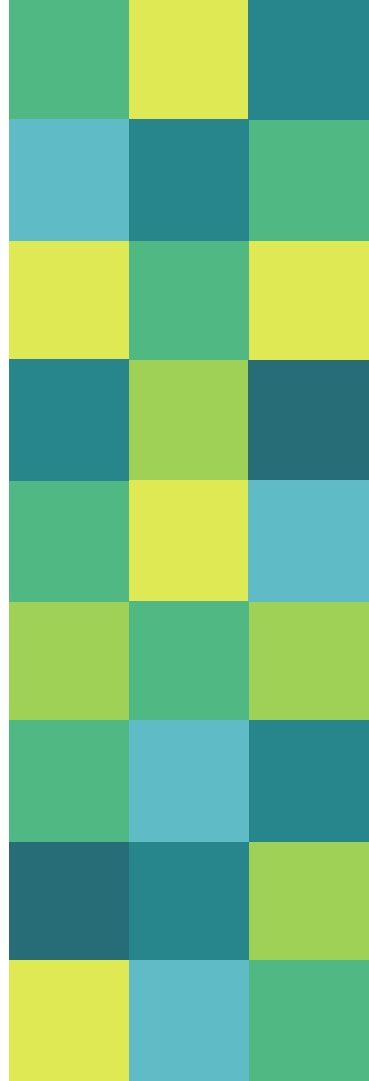
Student Wellness/Time- Create and implement a school culture plan that monitors and addresses social & emotional wellness and learning & behavior of all students and staff.

Goal 4:

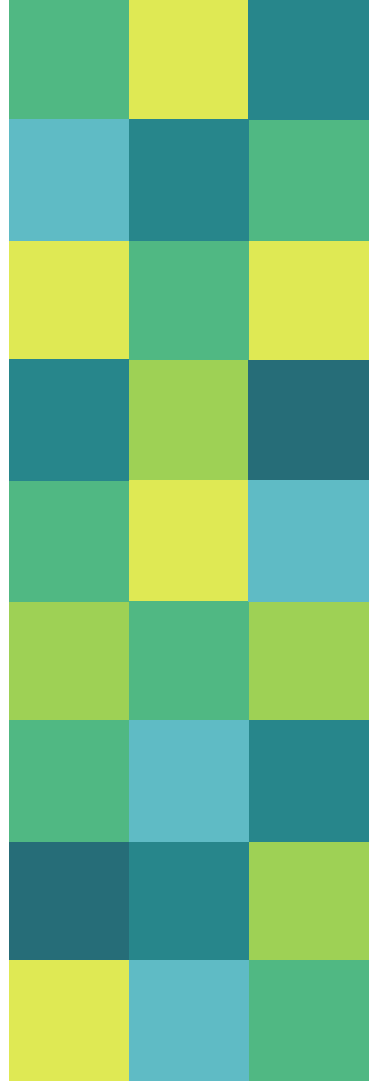
Academic Achievement- Cochrane Collegiate Academy will increase our overall school academic growth percentage 70 (meets growth).
