### **Grading and progress for Middle School Students**

We will continue with remote learning until May 29.

#### **Students in grades 6-8 will receive a Pass “PC19” or Withdrawal “WC19”**

- Students who were passing the course as of March 13, or who worked to improve to the point of passing after March 13 through remote learning, will receive a PC19.
- *Only students who are failing a course (≤59) after being provided the opportunity for improvement through remote learning, can be considered for receiving a WC19.*
- MS teachers will provide progress feedback for students and document using anecdotal records for non-HS courses.
- The district will provide a feedback document that will include the options for teachers to indicate whether students have been active or inactive, submitting work, and showing mastery on individual standards that were pushed out by the district as our essential standards to address during remote learning.
- Teachers will assess and provide feedback on a minimum of one, and a maximum of two assignments, weekly between May 1st - 29 to determine students' improvement.
- Progress for students **will not** be documented in PowerSchool. Only the final course code will be entered into PowerSchool.

#### **MS Courses for HS credit (Spanish part B or Native Speaker part B, Math 1)**

- Yearlong courses will be divided into 1st semester and a 2nd semester grades with each counting for .5 course credit.
- Middle school students taking courses for high school credit will be given a choice for how the second semester grade will appear on the high school transcript.
- Students will have three options for each second semester course grade:
  - Numeric grade (highest grade as of March 13th or as improved through the end of the semester)
  - Pass (PC19), or
  - Withdraw (WC19) *Only applicable for students who were failing as of March 13 and/or was unable to improve their grade.*
  - If the course is one that is required for graduation, the student will need to retake the course for credit.
- Students will have the same opportunities to improve their grade as non-HS credit students. Students/parents will make a choice about final grade reporting for each course taken (documented in PowerSchool).
- Second semester numerical grades for middle school students will not be included in their cumulative GPA.
