Full-Remote Learning or Remote Learning (Plan B+)



Full Remote Academy

Full-Remote Academy: Available to families in which there are health conditions placing children and/or family members in a high health risk category, students can commit to the Full-Remote Academy (identified as students in **Group D**).



- Students will have access to Honors/AP/MYP/IB Coursework.
- Students will have access to electives.
- Students will be assigned to a teacher at East Mecklenburg High School.
- A sub-section will be created within a teacher's regular class section denoted by section 700.
- Students in Full-Remote Academy will be assigned to the section 700 and receive access to the same curriculum/resources/assessments via Canvas
- Students will remain in the Full-Remote Academy until the end of semester 1 and/or end of the year, even if the district moves to Plan B or Plan A.
- If the district moves to Plan B or Plan A, students in Full-Remote Academy will continue to work from home via the Canvas course.
- Teachers will have Remote students and Full-Remote Academy students assigned to them.
- Students in Full-Remote Academy may have some “like” teachers to allow for working together, but selected electives will still drive the full schedule and may make it difficult to group all Full-Remote Academy students in one class.

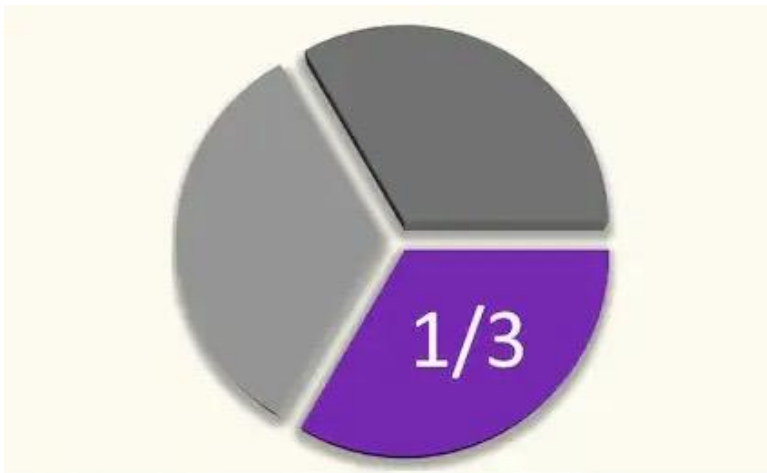
Remote Learning (Plan B+)

Group B will Attend School - **Thursday, August 20, Friday, August 21, Monday, August 24, and Tuesday, August 25 August 25** -

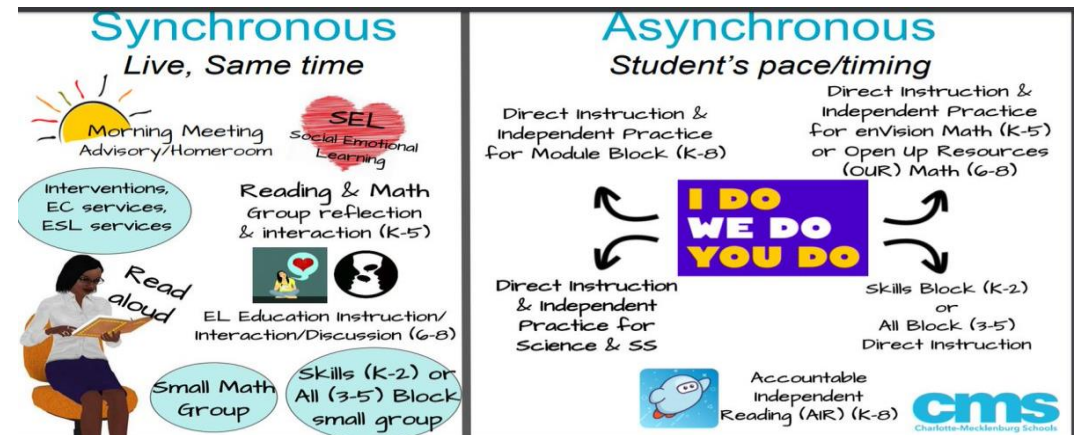
Group C will Attend School - **Wednesday, August 26, Thursday, August 27, and Friday, August 28** -

Start of **Remote Learning for Groups A, B, and C** - **Monday, August 31**



- **Expectations:**

- All students will be involved in learning starting on **Monday, August 17**. Students in groups B and C will have resources available in Canvas to begin working.
- For the first 10 days, all high schools will follow [a bell schedule](#) provided by the district. Following the first 10 days and when Remote Learning begins the district **MAY** adjust the start time for block 1 classes. We will continue to follow district guidance regarding start times and end times during remote learning.
- There will be a 45 minutes SEL (Social Emotional Learning) Advisory Period built in the daily schedule between first and second period.
- Remote learning will continue to follow a bell schedule in which teachers will have specific times each day for “live” instruction.
- There will be a **MINIMUM OF 40 MINUTES** of **synchronous instruction** (“live instruction”) per class per day (Semester and A/B Day schedule). While synchronous interaction is strongly and highly preferred, pre-recorded video may be used under some extenuating circumstances.
- Essential learning WILL INCLUDE options such as direct instruction (where applicable depending on course development), small group discussion, large group discussion/seminar, real-time feedback, etc...
- Asynchronous (“self-paced/student practice”) will be provided. **Recommended times are 35 minutes per class per day** (Semester and A/B Day schedule).





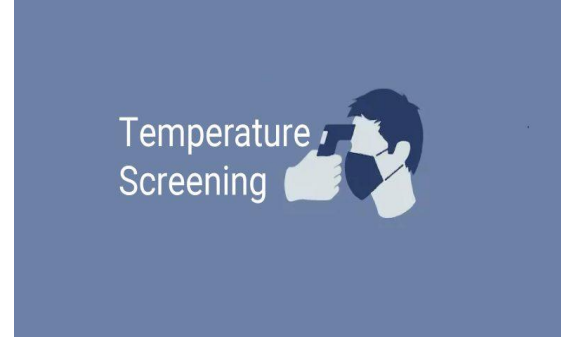
Attendance

- Currently, PowerSchool is scheduled to re-open to families on **Thursday, August 6**. Once opened, families will be able to see their assigned groups via PowerSchool.
- If a student is assigned to Group A, B, or C and does NOT attend the in-person sessions during the first 10 days, the student is marked UNEXCUSED absence. If the student completes the work online via Canvas, then the absence can be coded as an EXCUSED absence.
- If a student is assigned to group A, B, or C, then attendance on the non in-person days will be based on the student logging into Canvas for the day and completing any assigned work,
- Beginning **Monday, August 31**, attendance will be taken daily based on logging into Canvas. The process/expectation for logging into Canvas by a specific time each day is still being considered. More guidance will be provided.

Specific Information about East Meck Campus you need to know



- 6 feet away in classrooms, halls, and other common areas
- Hallways will have one-way traffic patterns
- Bathrooms will be monitored. Only two students allowed in at a time. Not during transitions
- Breakfast will be available in the classrooms
- Students will be divided into four different lunch periods with designated social distancing seating
- Dismissal will be staggered based on location and will begin at 1:45 p.m.
