- A. Pertaining to gender equity and sexual harassment
- B. Bullying policy has been modified with transgender addendums which have not yet been officially adopted (on hold until court case resolves)

V. SMART goals

- . Specific, Measureable, Attainable, Relevant, Time bound
- A. Updates on last year's goals:
  - 1. Performance on the ACT will increase from 56% of juniors meeting the college readiness benchmark (2014 - 2015) to 60% of juniors meeting the benchmark (met)
  - 2. Increase Math 1 GLP from 54% to 62% (Not met, 58%)
  - 3. AMO participation targets percentage met will increase from 71% to 81% (TBD in September - projected way over anticipated 81%)
  - 4. Reduce the number of 9th and 10th grade students retained by 50% (6% to 3%) by the end of the 2015 - 2016 school year (TBD - depends on summer school results still pending)
- B. Areas of focus/improvement for the 2016 - 2017 school year

1. ACT increase proficiency from 61.3% to (65% - 67% depending on number of student projected scores in the bubble range; mirroring state goal)
2. Increase college and career readiness on all EOC from 54.1% to 60% (wait to see NC average)
3. Increase percentage of levels 3 - 5 on AP exams
4. Considering a goal increasing retention rates for AOE students
