International Baccalaureate Middle Years Program (IBMYP) offers an accelerated learning program for students in grades 6-10 that develops intellectual skills and stresses high academic achievement through five Areas of Interaction: Environments, Community and Service, Approaches to Learning, Health and Social Education, and Human Ingenuity. Piedmont is a full IBMYP magnet school.

Failure to meet MYIB requirements will result in removal from the program and return to the home school.

- IBMYP requires a community service commitment:
 - ➤ 6th grade requires 20 hours of community and service.
 - > 7th grade requires 25 hours of community and service.
 - 8th grade requires a community and service project involving journal writing and completion of a project/ presentation.
- **Academic expectations** and grading standards are **high**. IBMYP is an accelerated program, and remedial classes are not offered.
- Students must score at or above grade level in reading and math End of Grade Tests.
- Students must enroll in and pass World Language, Core Classes, Health/PE, and one other encore (elective) class every year.
- Students must demonstrate continuing acquisition of technology skills.
- Access to the internet is required to complete various assignments & outside work.
- Students must take one course in the **cultural arts**.
- Students are encouraged to develop an appreciation and respect for other cultures.
- Students are expected to develop time management and organizational skills.
- Students must understand and apply the Global Contexts.
- Students must understand and apply the Design Cycle and pass IB assessments in every content area.
- Students must meet all Common Core Standards in addition to IB curriculum extensions in every content area.
- Parental involvement and support is crucial to the IBMYP program's success.
 Parents are encouraged to support teachers and administrators and to help the school and the PTSA through donations of time and resources.
- Parents are expected to regularly check **teachers' wiki-pages** and maintain **communication** with the school.
- Parents are expected to monitor grades using the PowerSchool Parent Portal.
 Progress reports are sent home at mid quarter for students receiving grades of D or F.
- Students must adhere to Piedmont's dress code, code of conduct, and attendance procedures. Failure to do so may result in removal from the program and return to the home school.
- All grade levels will be assigned a summer reading and math project. The Piedmont website should be accessed regularly during the summer for details.
